

Jewish Cemetery Neunkirchen

Description

The cemetery in Neunkirchen was founded in 1890. The two buildings in neo-Moorish style at the entrance connected by a wrought-iron gate are particularly striking. Before the cemetery was founded, the Jewish community buried its dead in the Jewish cemeteries of Lackenbach and Kobersdorf in what was then western Hungary. There are around 140 gravestones in the cemetery. The cemetery is locked, the key is available from the local authority.
