



## Jewish Cemetery Zwettl

### Data

#### Description

The Jewish cemetery in Zwettl was established in 1882 on the slope of the so-called Galgenberg and is adjacent to the Zwettl-Syrnau cemetery. The Jewish residents of Zwettl belonged to the Jewish Community of Waidhofen an der Thaya. Just a few gravestones and the cemetery caretaker's house have survived. The shape of the arch of the entrance gate is particularly striking. The cemetery is kept locked, the key can be obtained from the local municipal offices.
