Description

The Jewish cemetery in Graz was established in 1864 and extended in 1901. Before the cemetery was opened, the deceased of the small but rapidly growing Jewish community had to be brought to the nearest Jewish cemetery in Güssing, which at that time was still in western Hungary. At present the cemetery contains approx. 1,460 graves. The cemetery survived the Nazi period largely unscathed; only the ceremonial hall built in 1910 and a number of graves were destroyed. In the 1950s a temporary ceremonial hall was erected; in 1990/91 a new one was built by the City of Graz and transferred into the hands of the Jewish community. For safety reasons, the cemetery is not open to the public.

In addition, a general planner will be contracted: record of objects and damage, restoration work on graves and tombs, architectural planning services, perimeter wall (mixed masonry), renovation of the outer walls of the ceremonial hall and the cemetery gatekeeper's lodge, overall management and additional work on the inventory carried out with the help of aerial photos.
