

Jewish Cemetery Judenburg

Description

Following the expulsions that took place in the 15th century, Jewish families again began to settle in Judenburg from the mid-19th century. In 1873, they established their own cemetery. This was built to the northeast of Judenburg, in the once unspoiled village of Hetzendorf, which today forms part of the municipality of Fohnsdorf. The cemetery was ransacked in 1942 and the gravestones partly destroyed. A number of burials took place at the cemetery after 1945, but it is not accessible to the public today.
