



## Jewish Cemetery Trautmannsdorf

### Data

#### Description

Until World War II, the small cemetery in Trautmannsdorf was mainly used as a burial place for Jewish guests who had passed away in the nearby spa town of Bad Gleichenberg. The cemetery was completely destroyed in 1938. Today, just a few memorial stones still exist; some of them are for Hungarian-Jewish forced laborers whose mortal remains were transferred here from the surrounding area after 1945.
