The old Jewish cemetery was situated near the Alpenzoo on the slope of the “Judenbühel” from around 1503 to 1864. It was only rediscovered in the 1990s and has been the subject of scientific research and investigation since 2007. In 2009, the cemetery was enclosed with the fencing that stands there today. Guided tours can be organized through the Jewish Community for Tyrol and Vorarlberg in Innsbruck. The cemetery can be freely accessed by the public.
